Does your municipality have hourly automatic consumption data for electricity, gas or water in public buildings? Then the EU-funded EDI-Net project could be of interest to you: You can reduce your energy and water consumption with the help of innovative tools and the possibility of exchanging information with other cities.

For this purpose, short-term meter measurements of the energy and water consumption of municipal buildings are analysed in order to reduce energy consumption and thus save money. Our initiative supports your municipality in the introduction of sustainable energy and climate protection plans and helps to define financial plans for energy and water consumption. Three pilot sites share their knowledge and experience with you: Catalonia (Spain), Leicester (Great Britain) and Nuremberg (Germany).

If you want to drive to the Rathausaal with your car, the car park information of the city of Nuremberg gives you an online overview of the current occupancy figures of the 17 city centre car parks. Parking is available in the immediate vicinity in the multi-storey car park at the main market square.</p> <p><b>By train:</b> Nuremberg Central Station is integrated into the national and international EC, IC and ICE networks. From the main station you can easily reach the Rathausaal in about 15 minutes on foot or in a few minutes with the underground lines U1 and U11.</p>
